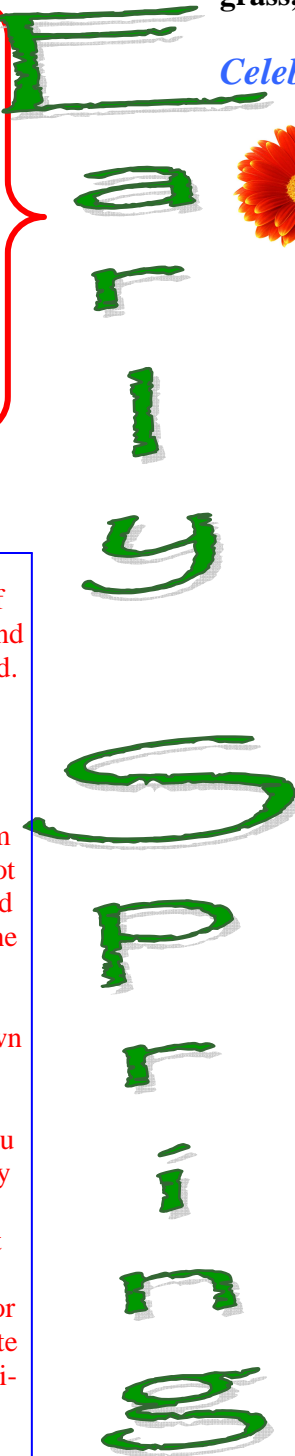
News From Les

The snow was a good for many plants as it protected them from the fluctuating temperatures. Several areas of grass are matted down from the snow and we have also seen a lot of gray snow mold this spring. Hand raking these areas should remedy the problem.

Key Points to keep in Mind this spring

- Rake lawn if possible. Besides cleaning up the lawn, it also stimulates new growth.
- Cut grass so it's 2 1/2" high after mowing.
- Mow weekly and use different patterns.
- Remove broken limbs from trees and shrubs.
- Remove dead leaves around perennials.
- Start mulching. Mulch provides beauty and protection, retains moisture while keeping out weeds. 3-4" of shredded mulch, bark or rock is recommended.
- Prune – Good pruning helps plants produce more blooms or fruit in addition to improving their looks. Great time to cut back your roses 6" from the ground.
- Equipment – Edgers, trimmers and mowers should be cleaned, oiled & tuned up, while old blades should be sharpened.
- Seeding – Since we treated your lawn today, hold off any seeding till mid August, unless you loosen soil to a 2" depth to break up the crabgrass preventor.
- Divide large clumps of perennials and add any new varieties now.
- Cut back Potentilla 6-8" above ground every 2-3 years.
